From the East

We are heading to the Grand Lodge Communication in October and there are several carryover resolutions from last year as well as new resolutions to be voted on. Voting members of Grand Lodge include the Masters and Wardens



of all California Lodges, as well as the Grand Lodge Officers, and one vote per lodge for all Past Masters of that Lodge. Here are some of the main resolutions we will be addressing:

Resolution No. 13-04: Permits the Officers Coach To Use the Cipher in a Tiled Meeting. If passed, the Officers Coach or his designate could have an open Cipher Ritual in a Tiled Meeting to prompt officers in their work.

Resolution No. 13-09: Requires the Warden Columns to Remain In Place While Lodge Is Free From Restraint. If passed, when the Master declares, "the brethren may consider themselves free from restraint" the columns on the Junior and Senior Warden's pedestals would not be moved as they currently are.

Resolution No. 13-11: Creates Guidelines for Life Membership Installment Payments. If passed, this resolution would allow people to make installment payments toward a life membership. **Resolution No. 13-12:** Modifies the Payment Structure of Life Membership Plans. This changes the formulas used to calculate how much a life membership costs someone based on their age.

Resolution No. 13-27/13-28: Modifies Minimum Dues/Fees for Degrees. These two resolutions seek to raise the minimum dues/fees to levels higher than 1946 levels.

Resolution No. 14-03: Allows Dues Based on the Lodge's Budget. If passed, this would allow a lodge to operate more like Grand Lodge with regard to dues. The budget would be created first, then all paying members would get a bill for their percentage.

Resolution No. 14-06: Standardizes Candidates Coaching Program. If passed, this would make it the specific responsibility of the Sr. Warden to oversee candidates coaching. This is currently a custom in many lodges but not a requirement.

Resolution No. 14-07: Modifies Rules on Personally Identifying Information. This resolution seeks to flip the requirements for allowing us to publish personally identifying information on our members. Instead of having to sign a form to allow, you would have to ask in writing not to have your information published. To me this just makes sense.

Resolution No. 14-09/14-10: Expands Permitted Fund Raising By Masonic Organizations. These resolutions hope to expand fundraising efforts to the general public and to allow lotteries, bingo, and raffles as well.

If you have any opinions on how your officers should vote, please speak with one of us directly.

This has been a great Masonic year and the future of this lodge looks to me to be extremely bright!






From the South


