However, as would be critics of such perceived errors, do we practice our Masonic ABC's? Do we seek light or do we seek to tear down? Are we builders carefully arranging the misplaced blocks and realigning the deviations found by our plumb or are we ruffians? Please, may we ever seek to always boost civil discourse!
