By the time this article has been published, we likely will have returned from our visitation to Columbia's Masonic Temple. Brother Frank Sepulveda, I congratulate you on your initiation into our ancient institution, and I hope your Ma-



sonic journey will be one filled with personal discovery, true enlightenment and sincere fellowship.

A few words on Columbia's Masonic Temple per our Grand Lodge website "This lodge building in Columbia...was built in 1855 as the meeting place for Columbia Lodge No. 28. In 1949, the Grand Lodge of California restored the building, which some lodges continue to use for degree ceremonies. The building includes a replica lodge room on the ground floor that shows what Masonic lodges looked like in the 19th century."

Further information from the Columbia State Park website states

that "In the mid-nineteenth century there were several wooden structures constructed on the lot where the Masonic Temple now stands. In 1853 Charles Cardinell purchased a three story frame building that was on the property. Cardinell ran the Saint Charles Restaurant on the first floor and the Saint Charles Hotel on the other two floors. After the building was destroyed in the great fire of 1854, a three-story brick structure was built on the lot. The Masons used the upper floor of this building. In 1863 the Masons bought the lower floor. In 1890 the brick building was torn down and the land was mined. The bricks were then used in the Rawhide mine. In 1947 the Columbia Historic Park Association bought the lot from the estate of Tom Conlin and then sold it to the State for \$1.00. In 1950 the present building was constructed by the Grand Lodge of Free and Accepted Masons of the State of California, and was given to the State in exchange for a fifty-year lease."

Notice of Bylaw Change Proposal:

At the Stated meeting of September 2015 a proposal was made that the application fees be raised from \$175.00 for each new member to \$300.00. The proposal will be voted on at our November Stated meeting. If the proposal passes a lodge vote, the amendment will be forwarded to the Grand Master for his approval. If he approves the change, it will go into effect on January 1, 2016 or on the month following his approval. This change will only affect new members. The application fees shall be applied to each degree in the same ratio as is currently in the bylaws. Total fees will be the sum of this fee increase being balloted upon plus such additional fees required by the Grand Lodge and the required donation to the Masonic Homes.

The publishing of this bylaw proposal in this month's Trestleboard meets the requirement that all Members receive a written notice of the proposed legislation.

Proposed by Bylaw change: Article III-Section 1. The table of fees for this Lodge shall be as follows:

A. For the degrees, the sum of \$300.00;

B. For the degrees of Fellow Craft and Master Mason, when the Entered Apprentice degree has been received in another Lodge, the sum of \$125.00 \$214.00;

C. For the degree of Master Mason, when the Entered Apprentice and Fellow Craft degrees have been received in another Lodge, the sum of \$128.00; and

D. For affiliation the sum of \$35.00. Exceptions: The affiliation fee shall be \$ 0 if the Demit accompanying the application is issued by this Lodge, or a Lodge in this Jurisdiction.

Article IV-Section 1. AMENDMENTS

Those portions of these Bylaws relating to the day and time of Stated Meetings and the amount of fees and dues may be amended at any Stated Meeting by a two-thirds vote of the members present who are in good standing. All proposed amendments must be presented, in writing, at a preceding Stated Meeting and written notice must be given to each Lodge member setting forth the text of the proposed amendment and the date of the Stated Meeting at which the vote is to be taken. It shall have no effect until approved by the Grand Master. The Secretary of the Lodge shall note in the minutes of the Lodge the notice of the proposed amendments when made. When transmitting an amendment for approval, he shall forward a certificate, under seal, showing that the law has been complied with and that the amendment has received the required vote.

Some of you have been asking about the cost of life membership. Below is the schedule. A sum of money equal to the Lodge's annual dues at the time of purchase of the life membership multiplied by the factor indicated opposite the member's age in the following schedule:

Age 49 and under, 21 times annual dues; 50 to 54 inclusive, 19 times annual dues; 55 to 59 inclusive, 17 times annual dues; 60 to 64 inclusive, 14 times annual dues; and 65 and over, 11 times annual dues.
