### The Virtue of Justice

Justice is the fourth masonic virtue. At the core of the word "justice" is the word "just" which is an adjective noting behaving to what is morally right. For a Freemason, there are several applications of justice in his life. First is knowing that his thoughts and actions are clearly visible before God, where nothing is hidden. This accountability leads to consistency between his moral thoughts and actions. This moral consistency extends to his relationship with God as well as with people.

Second is that a Freemason is to guide his thoughts and actions by the concept of justice, that is to be fair and impartial where possible, free of personal prejudices. Lady Justice is often depicted with a scale in her right hand, a sword in her left, and her eyes blindfolded. The blindfold represents the impartiality, that her personal perceptions do not alter her decisions. A Freemason is called to observe the masonic virtues of temperance, fortitude, prudence, and justice. Temperance to have self control over one's emotions, Fortitude to face adversity, Prudence to govern oneself through reason, and Justice to live morally before God and people while also being fair and impartial.


The Masonic Center for Youth and Families is located in San Francisco, but serves Masonic families throughout the state.
