How long is a cable tow? Many have asked but a few attempted to reply. In much older days it was generally considered to be three miles; that was when a brother was expected to attend lodge whether 🖉 he wanted to or not if within the length of his cable tow.

From the South Brethren,



I'm up to speed regarding the stated meeting dinners, and am burying my head in the ritual books at every opportunity, so all is well. This is my second year at our lodge. If we haven't met yet, please just shake my hand and say

hi. I want to get to know each of you well.

Many of you know that I'm very active in the York Rite, being Past Master of all the main bodies, and now serving as Secretary of my Royal Arch Chapter and Commandery of Knights Templar. You'll see me in lodge struggling to get the ritual words correct, as the York Rite ritual is very close, but not the same as Blue Lodge ritual. Since you likely don't know much about the York Rite, I thought I'd include some York Rite information in my column. Here's the first installment, from the Grand York Rite office.

A wise man will always have a thirst for further light. As each of the Blue Lodge Degrees are conferred. Entered Apprentice, Fellowcraft, Master Mason, additional light is sought and expected. But once raised, is this all the Light that can be received? Probably not! Masonry is so full of teachings, learning opportunities, and symbolism that it is impossible to receive and understand it all. Most of it is not found in the Blue Lodge Degrees.

In some Grand Lodges, we are informed that "the temple is not yet completed". Later we learn that the "Master's Word is Lost", and a substitute is given. These are the first clues that there must be "further light" and much more to learn of Ancient Craft Masonry.

Some two hundred years ago, most of our brethren were known as "Ancient York Masons". When the two Grand Lodges of England united in 1813, a firm and solemn landmark was adopted and placed in the articles of union to guide all Masons: "... pure ancient Freemasonry consists of but three degrees, that of Entered Apprentice, Fellowcraft, and Master Mason including the supreme order of the Holy Royal Arch."

At that time, only Past Masters of Symbolic Lodges were qualified to receive the Royal Arch Degree. But it was deemed that this degree was so important that those Master Masons having received the Mark Master Degree should be able to become Past Masters, thus making them eligible to witness the completion of King Solomon's Temple, and the Royal Arch Degree, where the long lost Master's Word is found. This degree was then taken from the Blue Lodges and established under separate bodies known as Chapters. Royal Arch Chapters confer the Mark Master, Past Master, Most Excellent Master, and Royal Arch Degrees.

The Blue Lodge Degrees, together with the Royal Arch Chapters, the Councils of Royal and Select Masters, and the Commanderies of Knights Templar, constitute the York Rite. "Further Light" may be found by completing all of the Degrees and Orders of the York Rite.


