The values they have passed down are still practiced: holding hands at the dinner table while prayer is said before eating; helping their neighbors in times of need; and doing their best to make sure that their children have the skills and fortitude to succeed in life. I am sure that many other members of our lodge have similar stories to tell, but do we take the time to reflect on them? Times have changed, we now have cars, trains, planes for fast travel, tv, computers and mobile devices on the internet for nearly instantaneous communications, but people have not changed that much except in their values be it for better or worse.

Masonry and the values that masonry stand for are still important in these time and in the future, a belief in God, morality, and the sense of community and brotherhood are important today and for the future. Our brethren in the past have passed down a legacy of acceptance and brotherhood that we have inherited and should continue to pass down to those who come after us.


For those who worked at June's Feast of Saint John, I send you many thanks from all who attended – without your time and talents none of this would be possible!


