From the South

I started discussing the Regius Poem this Summer, and this is a continuation. The Regius dates from 1390 AD, and is Freemasonry's oldest document.

The writer of some original manuscript, of which the Regius is a copy, was thoroughly familiar with the craft of Masonry. Much of the poem is devoted to setting forth "fifteen articles" and "fifteen points", which the manuscript states were the result of a great assembly called by King Athelstane, attended by "divers lords", and "dukes, earls and barons also knights, squires, and many more...". According to the poem: "Fifteen articles there they sought, and fifteen points there they wrought." No one can struggle through the old English with less than conviction that whoever wrote Regius, most certainly had before him some Constitutions of the Freemasons. Despite the rambling of the document (which includes not only the fifteen articles and fifteen points, a reference to the Four Crowned Martyrs, some early apocryphal history, the seven liberal arts and sciences, but also so much morality and discourse on manners) the Masonic intent of the whole is evident. It follows a pattern, if not in words at least in the arrangement, of many others of the Constitutions family.

Speculation can go as far as it will; where scientific inquiry and the researches of students leaves off, "just suppose" and "I wonder if" can begin! But it is truly difficult for anyone with even a small fragment of imagination to look at the facsimile of four verses which are the frontispiece and not let his mental inquiry go far afield. More Regius next month.

At present our Lodge has a population of 447 Master Masons. Our youngest member is 19.95 years old and the oldest has accomplished 100.62 years. Our age grouping by percentage is; 1 member at 0.22% is in their teens, 2 members at 0.45% are in their 20's, 11 members at 2.46% are in their 30's, 20 members at 4.47% are in their 40's, 48 members at 10.74% are in their 50's, 90 members at 20.13% are in their 60's, 120 members at 26.85% are in their 70's, 133 members at 29.75% are in their 80's, and 21 members at 4.70% are in their 90's, and 1 member at 0.22% is over 100 years. The average age of our membership is 71.93 years old.
