November is now upon us and as such, the 2025 calendar year is slowly com-



ing to a close. November is derived from the Latin word "novem" meaning the number nine. In the early Roman calendar, November was the ninth month; however as the Roman calendar was revised over time, November became the eleventh month.

Notable holidays this November include: November 2nd when Daylight Savings time ends, November

11th when we celebrate Veterans Day and November 27th when we celebrate Thanksgiving.

On the first Sunday morning of this November, please remember to set your clocks back one hour as we will now return to Standard Time. Daylight savings time will return once again on March 8th 2026. Most likely the menu at that time included venison, wild fowl, and shellfish.
