

A World of Masonry


This spring, the University of California, Los Angeles, will present its second International Conference, in conjunction with the California Masonic Foundation and the Institute for Masonic Studies.



This special day was originally created by Pope Gelasius who declared February 14 St. Valentine's Day around 498 A.D.

Originally, The Valentines honored were Valentine of Rome (Valentinus presb. m. Romae) and Valentine of Terni (Valentinus ep. Interamnensis m. Romae).

The first references to Valentine's Day being associated with romantic love was in 14th century England, in a poem written by Geoffrey Chaucer titled "the Parlement of Foules." It is thought to be written in honor of the engagement of King Richard II to Anne of Bohemia. Specifically referenced was the following line:

"For this was on seynt Volantynys day Whan euery byrd comyth there to chese his mate." [For this was Saint Valentine's day, when every bird of every kind comes to this place to choose his mate.]

Currently, there is no central record system to track Masonic cemetery properties. Some lodges

aren't even aware that they own and are responsible for a cemetery property.

A neglected Masonic cemetery or plot is a reflection on the fraternity at large, and can lead to maintenance and legal issues.

Cemetery Task Force

The Cemetery Task Force was established by Grand Master John Lowe to help ensure that local lodges are aware of their Masonic cemeteries and cemetery properties, including the ownership of individual plots. The goal is to put a system in place so lodges may properly maintain and pass these properties onto future generations of lodge leaders.

If you are a Past Master or Past Secretary of one of the lodges that combined to make Crow Canyon Lodge, and are aware of a Masonic cemetery or plot that we were responsible for, please contact me so I can report this information to the Grand Lodge.
