


I hope March finds you productive, happy and healthy.



There are still 52 members who have not paid their 2016 dues. If you are one of the 52, you are not in good standing. The lodge will have to pay the Grand Lodge your per-capita tax come July 1st at \$43.50 per member. That's \$2,262.00 that will come out of savings to pay the Grand Lodge per capita tax for each of you. We picked up a few new members from other lodges last month: Brother Ted Santel from Acacia 243 and Brother John Tomaso from a lodge in Cambridge, Massa-chusetts. Also our officers coach, Wor. Kurt Allen's son, Lelend was elected to receive the degrees of Masonry. Welcome all of you. Our membership is at 339 members and 253 widows.

We mail 510 Trestleboards each month and e-mail another 142 to lodge members and to other lodges.

The hall association and lodge financials were read at the February Stated Meeting. They are now a permanent record of the lodge. The lodge financial report has also been filed with the Grand Lodge. We have seven Golden Veteran's Awards (50 Year Pins) to give out throughout 2016. The first will be at our March Stated Meeting.

Masonic History Corner

As Published in the Masonic Messenger by Dewey Wollstein

Paul Revere of Revolutionary fame was a silversmith. He was a descendant of a French Huguenot family, the name being originally Revoire. He was born in Boston, January 1, 1735.

Bro. Revere was Raised in St. Andrew Lodge on September 24, 1760. The record tells us "It was laid before the Lodge, and in the same



evening work was commenced under it by receiving Paul Revere, a Goldsmith and engraver as E.A.

The above is a simple statement of facts, but think of its impact on history! Think of what this brother's contribution was in the struggle for American freedom!

His was a burning passion for freedom. He also knew that "the Masons" were the ones most feared by those whose loyalty rested with the royal government.

Masonry brought Paul Revere in touch with the best minds of the day, James Otis, Dr. Joseph Warren, Samuel Adams and others.

After the union of St. John's and Massachusetts Grand Lodges, Paul Revere became the second Grand Master and served in 1794-97.



So Paul Revere and the other Masons of the day met at the Green Dragon Tavern. They were busy men, but not so engrossed in their private endeavors as to close their eyes to what was going on about them. They refused to accept a temporary safety in lieu of freedom.

What were these Masons doing? They were meeting, planning, working, sacrificing for what we now take for granted, and which we always stand to lose because of apathy and indifference.
