### **From the West**

weather in the bay area tends to be more bearable than many other places in the country... it's still too hot for my tastes when the mercury rises above the 75 mark! The Dog days of summer happen at the start of August – so named because it's the time in the northern hemisphere when Sirius (the "Dog Star") is



rising in the heavens near the sun. Celestial events aside, in Masonry I've started to associate August with "Study month" as for the past few years I've been spending a lot of time during

August studying my ritual, so that I can be ready to give my proficiency to the inspector in the early fall, to qualify for the next spot in the line that I'm aspiring to climb to.

Not that I wait until August to start learning the ritual... well... ok, yeah, mostly that's what I do, barring some early read-throughs. August is too hot to be outside doing anything, so why not spend more of that inside time hitting the books? This can be something that applies to all of us, not just those of us in the line - for all of you who haven't completed your third degree proficiency yet - or second, or first, for that matter – August is a good double-down to on learning vour time proficiencies! Reach out to me if you need any help-I may not be able to work with you myself directly, but can definitely find you an expert coach from the lodge to speak to and help you along. Many of us know that "August" is named after "Augustus Ceasar" from Roman times, but it's less known that it was originally the SIXTH month of the calendar, and was named "Sextilus" by the Romans, meaning "Sixth month." ...so It wasn't just in architecture that the Romans lacked originality, apparently. The Romans had adopted the Greek Lunar calendar, which had only 10 months, and they used this for quite a while - until Julius Ceasar decided that it needed an overhaul, and after consulting with a Greek astronomer named Sosigenes, the calendar was updated to have twelve months... and (incidentally, I'm sure) had the seventh renamed in honor of none other than Julius Ceasar himself. To adjust to the new calendar, there were extra days added in the year 46 BC instead of 365, that year had 445 days! After Julius came Augustus, who followed suit, and had the

eight month renamed "August" after himself. Emperors can get away with that sort of thing, apparently.

Well, for those of us without months named after us, let's all take care to keep cool this month – with record-setting heat being experienced all over the world, it's especially



important that you practice good sense if you need to go out in the heat – wear sunscreen and a widebrim hat, bring water, and make sure you don't go hiking or biking in the heat without a buddy along to help out in case the heat gets to be too much.
