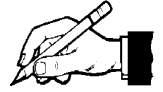

Brethren, if you are among the 34 members who have not paid your dues for 2010, please send it in as soon as you can. If you are unable to pay let me know either by e-mail crowcanyon551@sbcglobal.net or by the traditional method the US mail service. The per capita tax that our lodge is required to pay Grand Lodge will be due soon. This year the tax is \$33.00 per member. 8 members are about to be suspended, something that I really don't want to do, but the rules are clear and the California Masonic Code requires it.

At present our Lodge has a population of 401 Masons. Our youngest member is 22.53 years old and the oldest has accomplished 103.2 years. The chart below shows the breakdown by age group.

From The South

The Fellowcraft degree is the degree of transmutation. The candidate must use the hand that slays to lift the suffering, while the lips given to cursing must be taught to pray. The heart that hates must learn the mystery of compassion, as the result of a deeper and more perfect understanding of man's relation to his brothers. The firm, kind hand of spirit must curb the flaming powers of emotion with the iron grip of mastery. In the realization and application of these principles lies the key of the Fellowcraft.

In this degree, the candidate's attention is called to a change in the positioning of the compass and the square. The two points of the compass can symbolize the heart and mind. The square is an instrument used to measure the block of matter and therefore symbolizes form. With the expression of the higher emotion the point representing the heart is liberated from the square.

In the Fellowcraft degree is concealed the dynamic of human life. The Fellowcraft is the worker with elemental fire, which it is his duty to transmute into spiritual light. The heart is the center of his activity and it is while in this degree that the human side of nature with its constructive emotions should be brought out and emphasized, but all of these expressions of the human heart must be transmuted into the emotionless compassion of the gods, who in spite of the suffering of the moment, gaze down upon mankind and see that it is good.

The Entered Apprentice may be termed a materialistic degree. The Fellowcraft is spiritual and mystical, while the Master Mason is more philosophical or esoteric. Each of these is a degree in the "peeling back of the layers" of a connected life and intelligence, which reveals in ever greater expression the gradual liberation of the Master from the triangular cell of threefold negation which marks the early stage of individualization.

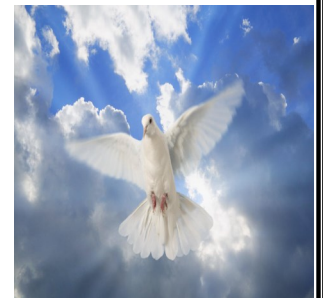
