

Brethren, As Senior Warden it is my duty to pay the craft their wages if any be due that none may go away dissatisfied. We have been taught that the wages of a Fellowcraft are corn, wine and oil. But why these things? Part of the story of the building of King Solomon's Temple is in 2 Chronicles 3-16. Here we learn that King Solomon is requesting Cedars of Lebanon from King Hyrum of Tyre and Solomon promises "I will give your servants, the woodsmen who cut the timber, twenty thousand cors of ground wheat, twenty thousand cors of barley, twenty thousand baths of wine and twenty thousand baths of olive oil." Masonic Tradition informs us that the Fellowcraft were the hewers in the Quarries and in the valleys. Now I begin to see why corn (or barley), wine and oil are the wages of a Fellowcraft.

But in today's Speculative Lodge, what are the wages of a Fellowcraft? I believe the wages or benefits of Masonry today lie in the three precious jewels of a Mason... brotherly love, relief and truth.

As we begin to examine our lodge, to build our symbolic Solomon's temple, let us focus on those three precious jewels and ensure that the craft receive their wages so that none may go away dissatisfied. **Brotherly love** – Are we as Masons, collectively and individually, consistently displaying this virtue through word and deed?

Relief – Are we as Masons, collectively and individually, providing for those in need, not just our brethren in Freemasonry, but throughout our greater community?

Truth – Are we as Masons, collectively and individually, leading our lives by the square, the plumb and the level?
